2. In each Semester, the Department can offer either 5 papers of 4 credits (i.e. 5 x 4 = 20 credits) or 6 papers of which 4 will be of 4 credits and 2 will be of 2 credits (i.e. 4x4 + 2x2 = 20 credits)

3. In case of M.Tech. Programme, the Project work will be either 4 credits or multiple of 4 credits as reflected in their semester-wise programme.

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4. The results of 1st, 2nd and 3rd Semester will be published on the basis of 20 credits core course only. The results of fourth and final semester results will be prepared taking into consideration 80 credits core course offered by the Department and 10 credit course comprising (i) Env. Studies & Disaster Management. (2 credit), (ii) Inter Dept. Course (IDC) or Open Elective (3 credit), (iii) Entrepreneurship Development (2 credit), (iv) MOOCs (3 credit).

5. The students will take one MOOCs Course according to his/her preference in consultation with HOD and submit the document in support of undertaking the MOOCs course to the respective Department.

6. Students will apply in prescribed form their preference for NCC/NSS/Sports/Performing Art/Yoga at the beginning of the session. The consolidated list of the same will be forwarded by the HODs to the office of the Chairman, P.G. Council. Depending upon the number of application, maximum capacity and preference, the students will be allotted one of the above non-credit courses.

7. For 2 years MBA Programme, 3 years executive MBA Programme and 3 years Integrated B.Ed/M.Ed Programme, the semester-wise skeleton will be submitted separately by the concerned Department in conformity with the AICTE or other guidelines under which it is covered.

For Unit-I, Unit-II, Unit-III and Unit-IV

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Each questions will be of 15 marks and there should have alternative in each unit. The distribution of 15 marks will be decided by the paper setter.

[Suggested patterns distribution of 15 marks are 15; 8+7; 7.5+7.5; 5+10, 2+3+10, 5+5+5 etc.]

b. For End-Term Examination of Total Marks 80 (Five Units Course)

Q.1 Twenty Questions of 1 mark each (Questions patterns should be of MCQ, Fill in the Blanks, True/False, Definition etc.) (20 x 1 = 20)

For Unit-I, Unit-II, Unit-III, Unit-IV and Unit-V

Each questions will be of 12 marks and there should have alternative in each unit. The distribution of 12 marks will be decided by the paper setter.

[Suggested patterns distribution of 12 marks are 12; 8+4; 6+6; 2+3+7, 4+4+4 etc.]

c. For End-Term Examination of Total Marks 60 (Four Units Course)

Q.1 Twelve Questions of 1 mark each (Questions patterns should be of MCQ, Fill in the Blanks, True/False, Definition etc.) (12 x 1 = 12)

For Unit-I, Unit-II, Unit-III and Unit-IV

Each questions will be of 12 marks and there should have alternative in each unit. The distribution of 12 marks will be decided by the paper setter.

[Suggested patterns distribution of 12 marks are 12; 8+4; 6+6; 2+3+7, 4+4+4 etc.]

11. Pass percentage

For each paper pass percentage is 30% (G.P. 4). For clearing the semester Grade Point Average (GPA) should be 4.5 (40%).

For IDC, Environmental Studies and Disaster Management and Entrepreneurship Development Programme the pass percentage is 30% (G.P. 4).

For MOOC course the pass percentage is as per the programme guideline

12. For the Students of the Environmental Studies the compulsory paper will be on "Environmental Field Survey of 2CH" instead of "Environmental Studies and Disaster Management"

For the Students of Business Administration, the compulsory paper will be on "Industrial Field Survey 2CH" instead of "Entrepreneurship Development Programme"

13. A student having failed in any paper(s) can simultaneously appear in repeat examination in those failed paper(s) and improvement examination in other papers of his/her choice. However, total number of papers in which a student can opt for improvement will remain four papers (i.e. same as per the existing guideline) within 8 semesters from the first registration.

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14. Conduct of Examination for IDC, Environmental Studies and Disaster Management and Entrepreneurship Development Programme. The Department offering the Course will conduct the Examination and send the marks to the HOD of the students. HODs of the Non-Autonomous Departments will send this to the COE unit.
15. In order to avoid the clash of other examinations i) the examinations of Environmental Studies and Disaster Management paper for Science students and Entrepreneurship Development Programme for Humanities students will be held in the mid of IInd semester, ii) the examinations of Environmental Studies and Disaster Management paper for Humanities students and Entrepreneurship Development Programme for Science students will be held in the mid of IVth semester in order to avoid the clash of other examinations, iii) The examinations of IDC courses for both Humanities and Science students will be held in the mid of IIIrd semester.

The examination of specific papers will be held at the same time in all the departments.
