While both ICM and KM are crucial parts of organizational success, their interaction in the context of Indian B-schools remains relatively unexplored. Since educational institutions—including B-schools—rely extensively on knowledge production, transmission, and utilization to achieve their goals, both ICM and KM are essential. Some studies have explored ICM or KM independently in the Indian B-school context, there is a lack of research examining their interrelationships and synergies.</p> <p>This research gap provides an opportunity to look into the dynamics of how both of these ideas coincide and influence each other in the Indian B-school scenario (Dixon et al., 2007). There may be practical implications for investigating the</p>

		relationship between ICM and KM in Indian B-schools. It may be beneficial for administrators and decision-makers in business schools to learn how to make the most of their existing resources, such as faculty expertise, student abilities, and institutional partnerships. To help Indian B-schools promote a culture of knowledge creation, innovation, and learning, it can be helpful to understand how ICM and KM interact with and impact one another.
