GUIDELINE FOR CONDUCT OF EXAMINATION AND QUESTION PATTERN

The end semester examination will be of three hours irrespective of marks

A. For subject without having practical

For subject without having practical full marks are 100 per paper out of which 20 marks allotted for Internal Assessment Examination and 80 marks for end semester examination.

The question papers shall be divided into two parts such as Group- A & Group-B.

- i. Group- A will carry 8 short questions (two short questions from each units) of 2.5 marks each. However, for language departments there will be five short questions from all the 4 units carrying 5 marks each.
- ii. Group-B shall have 4 long type questions of 15 marks each and there shall be one question from each unit with one alternative.

B. For subject having practical

For subject with practical full marks are 100 per paper out of which 20 marks is allotted for Internal Assessment Examination, 50 is for End Semester Examination and 30 is for practical.

The question papers shall be divided into two parts such as Group- A & Group-B.

- i. Group- A will carry 8 short questions of 1.25 mark each.
- ii. Group-B shall have 4 long type questions of 10 marks each and there shall be one question from each unit with one alternative.
- iii. Practical will carry 30 marks out of which 10 will be for records.
 - 2. The undergraduate as well as post graduate syllabuses may be revised suitably and also must incorporate the objective and expected outcome of each paper along with suggestive readings/references. As regards the Science and Practical-oriented subjects, information must be given regarding equipment/apparatuses needed for practical examinations.

Further, the Academic Council may consider the introduction of courses of skill enhancement for employability in PG level and the following four add-on courses shall be introduced in PG Level which shall be over and above credit hours.

- i) Soft and IT skills
- ii) Leadership/ Personality Development
- iii) Communicative English
- iv) Entrepreneurship and Development

These courses shall be purely optional and non-credit courses out of which two courses to be offered by the students in the first and third semester respectively.

The non-credit courses shall be reflected in the Degree Certificates, adding to the academic and skill-based credentials of the students and with a view to brightening their employment prospects.

(9) Dr. T.K.Das to move on behalf of the Vice Chancellor:

That the Academic Council do consider and approve inclusion of "Accredited with Grade A by NAAC" and in each original/ provisional certificate awarded to the pass candidates after 2018 for each programme. Further it may also consider to award provisional certificate with the words "This degree pursued is in conformity with the provisions of UGC Regulations, 2016".
