7. Pass Mark:

- (a) 35 marks in each paper and 50% of total marks in aggregate in each semester Examination. However, in case of Practical paper, the candidate has to secure 35% marks in aggregate in theory component and 50% marks in Practical record and viva voce examination
- (b) A candidate securing in all the ten semester examination taken together
 - 50% or more marks but less than 60% marks shall be awarded 2nd Class. Such student will be awarded with B.B.A, LL.B. (Hons.) 2nd Class and
 - ii. A candidate securing 60% or above marks in aggregate shall be awarded 1t class. Such students will be awarded with B.B.A, LL.B. (Hons.) 1st Class.

8. Back Paper/Improvement of Marks:

- (a) The candidate who has failed in a Semester examination can avail four successive chances to clear that examination. If a candidate has secured less than 50% marks in aggregate, he can appear in any paper to secure pass marks in aggregate.
- (b) A candidate can improve/repeat in any paper of a Semester in four subsequent chances, subject to a maximum of four papers.

9. Number of chances for clearing a particular semester and the course:

An unsuccessful candidate will be allowed 4 subsequent chances to clear a particular semester examination. A student admitted into 5 years integrated LL.B. course shall have to clear the course within ten years from the date of admission.

10. Eligibility to obtain B.B.A, LL.B. (Hons.) Degree:

(a) A candidate shall be entitled to obtain B.B.A, LL.B. (Hons.) degree after passing all the semester examination of the course. A candidate shall not be allowed to seat in 10th Semester examination unless he/she clears 1st, 2nd, 3rd,4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th Semesters. As the course is integrated one no student can claim either B.B.A. or LL.B. degree separately.
